- Unusual upper body pain or discomfort in neck, jaw, one or both arms, back, shoulder, or stomach
- Nausea/vomiting
- Shortness of breath
- Breaking out in a cold sweat
- Lightheadedness or sudden dizziness
- Unusual fatigue

- Shortness of breath, with or without chest discomfort
- Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness
